From the President

Rules on Rules on Rules

One observation that has come up recently is that we often start with a simple, clearly defined rule. Then something happens. Then we add more language to address that situation. Then another situation comes up, and we add even more language. Before long, the rule has so many layers that it becomes harder to remember what the original purpose was.

A good example is the suspension process for past-due balances. Each year, members with a past-due balance receive notices before April 1. If the balance remains unpaid, membership privileges are suspended and gate fobs are deactivated. The intent is simple: if a member is not in good standing, campground access is suspended until the member has paid his bill.

Most members understand and respect that process. However, occasionally a situation comes up where a suspended member attempts to enter the campground as the guest of another member in good standing. When questioned, the response is often, "Where does it specifically say I can't do that?"

That is how rules begin to grow. A rule that seemed clear in its intent suddenly needs additional language to address a specific exception or interpretation. Then another exception comes up, and more language is added. Over time, the rulebook gets longer and more complicated.

There are a couple of ways to handle these situations. One is to keep adding more specific language to the rules. Another is to allow the Manager to make a reasonable determination based on the intent of the rule, issue a violation if appropriate, and allow the member to appeal to the Hearing Board. In some cases, the best answer may be a combination of both.

The bigger point is this: rules work best when everyone respects not only the words on the page, but also the purpose behind them. The more members try to test the edges of a rule, the more likely it becomes that the rule will need to be expanded. Common sense and fairness can go a long way toward keeping our rules clear, simple, and manageable.

Background Check Policy Approved / Review Committee Members Needed

The Board of Directors has approved the Association's Criminal Background Check Policy. The purpose of this policy is to help promote the safety, welfare, and general well-being of our members, guests, employees, volunteers, and visitors.

In simple terms, the policy creates a consistent process for background screenings when they are required. This includes membership applicants, certain volunteers, employees, Board candidates, and contractors where applicable. The policy is intended to balance the Association's responsibility to protect the campground community with the need to treat each person fairly, consistently, and respectfully.

As part of this process, the Board has created a **Review Committee**. The responsibilities of the Review Committee will include:

- Reviewing background check information when required under the policy;
- Considering information in a fair, consistent, and individualized manner;
- Requesting additional information or clarification when appropriate;
- Making recommendations based on the policy and the circumstances presented;
- Maintaining strict confidentiality throughout the process.

Because this Committee will review sensitive and confidential information, all members selected to serve will be required to sign a confidentiality acknowledgment. Members of the Review Committee will be approved by the Board of Directors and will serve a three-year term. To be eligible, an applicant must be a member in good standing.

Members who are interested in serving on the Review Committee are asked to submit a letter or email stating their interest. The request does not need to be lengthy, but it should include your name, lot number, email address, and a brief statement explaining why you are interested in the Committee.

Please submit your request to be considered for the Review Committee to the President at president@srcahome.com no later than **August 1, 2026**.

The Board expects to review and approve Review Committee members by the August 16, 2026 Board meeting.

Thank you to any member willing to consider serving in this important role. This Committee will help the Association implement the policy in a responsible, confidential, and fair manner.

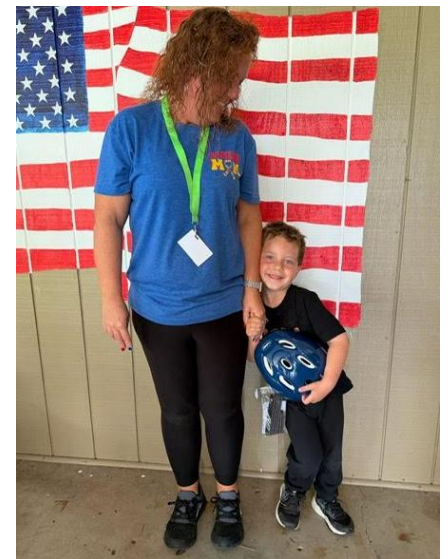
Brain Awareness Month & Brain Safety Fair Success

Nominating/Election Committee

Committee meeting: We met on June 7 to review proposed Nominating and Election Committee Bylaw amendments and the candidates' guidelines. See more information on the proposed Bylaws amendments in the Bylaws Committee article.



For the election guidelines, and with complying with Bylaws ART IV Sec 2, a candidate must be a member in 'good standing'; Unless our Bylaws state differently, a member in good standing is current on all financial obligations and no pending suspensions or disciplinary action. Therefore, the committee approved to replace the criteria that the member is ineligible if they have a Major Offense in the file for the last three years.

That is being replaced with:

- Candidate must be a member in good standing of the Association as set forth under Bylaw Article II, including being current on all financial obligations and having no pending or finalized disciplinary actions that can result in suspension.

Elections: Our annual election season is fast approaching. For those with an interest to run for the Board of Director for your section, Letters of Intent will be available July 3. There will be reminders sent out via email blast and also postings on our Facebook page. (Slippery Rock Campground Community page).

When they are available, members will be able to find them on our website (srcahome.com) by scrolling down to the message board for the link. Paper copies will be available in the office too. More details will be found in the packet.

Dates to remember:

- July 3 – Election guidelines/Letters of Intent will be available.
- July 24 –Last day to submit your Letter of Intent
- Aug 8 – Election packet/Ballots will be mailed to the membership.
- Aug 15 – Meet the Candidates, 10:30 AM
- Sept 3 - Deadline to have your ballot returned to the SR post office.

We have tentatively scheduled a Meet the Candidates on Saturday, August 15th in the Rec Hall which is one week after the election packets will be mailed to the membership. For those with summer and winter addresses, the ballot packet will be mailed to your summer address. PLEASE be sure the Office has your most current address.

Lastly, a Thank you to all the committee members who worked on the Bylaw amendments and the guidelines and a shout-out to Jim Milligan and Bev Trozzo for your help and feedback.

Bylaws Committee



The committee met on June 13 to review the Articles and Sections of our Bylaws for the Nominating and Election committee. There were 13 in attendance.

There are four (4) articles that refer to the Nominating committee as the committee that **nominates** the candidates. In actuality, the committee does not nominate candidates- we qualify them. The PA non-profit corporation's law basically says that **all qualified members should have the opportunity to run** and not 'be chosen' by the committee. In practice, our members submit a Letter of Intent, then the committee verifies their qualifications. The proposed changes more accurately portray what we actually do. What we do today, as in the past, is fair to all members.

The proposed amendments will be to:

1. MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS - ARTICLE III, Sec 5 (b)(ii)
2. BOARD OF DIRECTORS - ART IV Sec 1 (2nd sentence,)
3. BOARD OF DIRECTORS - ART IV Sec 2
4. COMMITTEES - ART VI, Sec 7(c).
5. CORRECTIONS in those cases where it is written 'the Nominating Committee'. There are three (3) correction to change 'Nominating Committee' to 'Nominating and Election Committee'.

Most of these changes are small, but certainly change the meaning. Such as

#1 ART III, Sec 5 (b(ii)) reads *All write-in candidates must possess the same qualifications as those provided under Article IV for candidates presented by the Nominating and Election Committee.* (Delete 'presented by the Nominating and Election Committee.')

#2 ART IV, Sec 1, 2nd sentence currently reads: *Directors shall be elected from those names submitted **by** the Nominating Committee and from any write-in candidates.* Instead, have it read 'submitted **to and qualified by** the Nominating and Election Committee.'

#3 ART IV, Section 2. Any candidate for the Board of Directors nominated by the Nominating Committee or as a write-in candidate must meet the following qualifications. (delete 'nominated by the Nominating Committee')

#4 ART VI, Sec 7 (c). The Nominating and Election Committee shall **make** as many nominations for election to the Board of Directors as it shall in its discretion determine, but not less than the number of vacancies that are to be filled.

Proposed change: The Nominating and Election Committee shall **review** the qualifications of all proposed candidates for election to the Board of Directors, based on the qualifications for any candidate for the Board of Directors set forth in these Bylaws.

Last month's newsletter explained the other three proposed Bylaws amendments which are:

1. To add electronic voting to our balloting method.
2. To change our annual audit to an annual financial review.
3. To add emailing as an option for members to receive notifications from the office

All proposed Bylaws amendments will be presented to the Board at the July Board meeting.

Small Games of Skill

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court has issued a decision finding that so-called Games of Skill are unlawful under current Pennsylvania law. The decision reportedly provides a 120-day period before enforcement action may begin, giving the Pennsylvania Legislature time to determine whether it will address the issue through new legislation.

Because these machines are currently on the Association property, we will continue to monitor the issue, consult with the vendor, and take whatever steps are necessary to remain compliant with Pennsylvania law.

We will provide additional information as it becomes available.

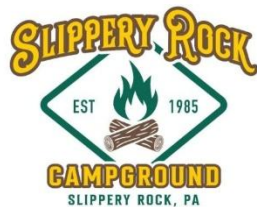

Mental Health Minute

The Architecture of Joy: How to Catch, Keep, and Cultivate True Happiness

We tend to treat happiness like a rare, beautiful weather event. We wait for the skies to clear, hoping a perfect sunny day will arrive, and when it does, we try to hold onto it before the clouds inevitably roll back in.

But true, lasting happiness isn't a climate pattern we are powerless to change. It is an active practice. It is something we learn to build, nurture, and sustain through the intentional choices we make every single day.

If you want to shift your baseline from merely getting by to genuinely thriving, it helps to understand the three distinct phases of joy: **catching it, cultivating it, and keeping it.**

1. Getting Happy: The Art of the Spark

"Getting happy" is about behavioral activation—taking small, deliberate physical actions that break the inertia of a heavy mood and inject immediate energy into your day. When you need a quick lift, don't wait for your mind to magically feel better. Let your actions lead your feelings.

Radiate Gratitude Intentionally

Gratitude isn't just a passive feeling; it's a lens that actively rewires how your brain scans the environment. Instead of a generic mental list, try sending a brief, unexpected text to someone thanking them for something specific they did. The act of expressing appreciation creates an immediate, mutual loop of positive emotion.

Move Your Chemistry

Our physical state directly governs our mental state. If you feel stuck, change your physiology. A fast ten-minute walk outside, shifting your posture, or putting on a favorite, high-energy track can trigger an immediate release of endorphins and dopamine.

2. Being Happy: Living in the Present Tense

Once you catch that spark of happiness, the next step is learning how to sit in it. True fulfillment isn't a destination you arrive at once all your problems are solved; it is the ability to recognize and taste the good that is already present in your life right now.

Anchor in the Senses

We miss a massive amount of daily joy because our minds are living three days in the future or two weeks in the past. To practice *being* happy, anchor yourself firmly in the present sensory moment.

The Practice of Savoring: When you drink your morning coffee, don't scroll through notifications. Actually taste the roast, feel the warmth of the mug in your hands, and notice the quiet of the room. Savoring stretches a fleeting pleasant moment into a deep, conscious experience of well-being.

Lean Into Your Authentic Self

Happiness flourishes when your daily life aligns with your core values. Make regular time for the things that feed your spirit just for the pure joy of them—whether that's spending an hour working with your hands, diving into a favorite creative hobby, or connecting deeply with nature.

3. Staying Happy: Building the Sustainable Reservoir

The ultimate goal isn't to live in a perpetual state of high-energy euphoria—that's not how human biology works. Staying happy is about building a deep, resilient reservoir of peace that keeps you anchored even when life gets turbulent, busy, or stressful.

The Pillar	How it Protects Your Peace
Value-Based Choices	Decisions made from your deepest convictions create a life free of internal friction and regret.
Warm Boundaries	Protecting your time and emotional energy ensures you have enough gas in the tank to show up beautifully for the things that matter.
Micro-Routines	Small, non-negotiable daily habits—like a morning walk or a brief evening wind-down—keep your baseline stable.

The Power of the Pivot

Staying happy doesn't mean you never feel sad, frustrated, or overwhelmed. True emotional flexibility means allowing yourself to feel the full spectrum of human emotion without getting stuck there. When a stressful day knocks you off balance, don't judge yourself. Simply acknowledge the storm, tap into your tools, and gently guide yourself back to your center.

The Journey Forward

Happiness isn't a prize reserved for a lucky few. It is a vibrant, renewable resource that lives inside your daily choices, your perspective, and your willingness to appreciate the beauty of the ordinary. By chasing the sparks, savoring the present, and protecting your peace, you build a joyful life that is entirely your own.


